Holmes is put on the case

■ The world's most sophisticated major crimes computer system gets out its magnifying glass.

ST. PETERSBURG — Imagine sifting through information about the thousands of people who bought dark-colored Bronco trucks in the United States over a three-year period.

That would be a mind-boggling task for any detective. But it is a snap for Holmes.

Holmes, which stands for Home Office Large Major Enquiry System and honors the great fictional detective, is considered the world's most sophisticated computer system for investigating major criminal cases.

The St. Petersburg Police Department, the only U.S. police agency equipped with Holmes, is now applying the system's abilities to solving the murders of Joan Rogers and her teen-age daughters on Tampa Bay.

British police developed Holmes out of frustration with the case of Yorkshire Ripper. Accused killer Peter Sutcliffe is believed to have murdered 13 women in northern England in the 1970s before he was caught. By then, the fact that five different detectives had identified him as a possible suspect had become lost in the 24 tons of files accumulated in the case.

Holmes, developed in 1984, can sift through mountains of information at a rate of more than 1-million words a minute, seeking whatever a detective tells it to.
