Holmes sat in a

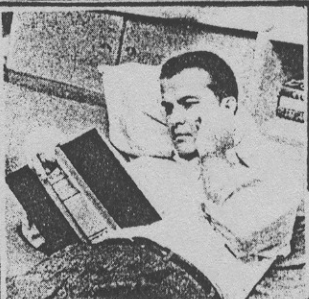
dimly-lit bar, observing four well-known criminals who were sitting around a square table.
