CHEESE-ONION PENNIES

When Neville St.Clair's coat was discovered "... stuffed with .. 270 half-pennies", in (TWIS), one might deduce that he really liked these tasty canapes! Why not serve them at your 12th Night Revels soiree?

1 stick butter or margerine
½ lb. (1 cup) sharp cheese, finely grated
1 cup flour ½ pkg. onion soup mix
Dash red pepper

Have cheese & butter at room temp.. Mix and add ingredients together 'til well blended, using fingers, if necessary. Form in rolls about 1½" in diameter. Wrap in waxed paper, then seal and freeze. While still cold, cut in thin slices and bake in 375° oven for 10 minutes, or until brown at edges. Serve hot or cold. They can be frozen again


