ROASTED POTATOES and SAUSAGE

(Holmes enjoyed this tasty repast after solving the "Case of the Two Coptic Patriarchs".)

1 3/4 lbs. small red potatoes, cut into quarters 3/4 lb. kielbasa or other smoked sausage, cut into ½-inch slices

1 Tblsp. Dijon mustard t cup mayonnaise 2 Tablespoons tarragon-flavored vinegar 2 Tablespoons minced fresh parsley

teaspoon ground pepper

t cup minced green onions

Line a 13x9" pan with aluminum foil; grease foil. Spread potatoes and sausage into prepared pan. Bake at 400° for 50 to 60 min., or until potatoes are tender, stirring after 30 minutes.

Combine mayo and remaining ingredients; stir Immediately toss potatoes and sausage with mayo mixture. Serve warm. Serves 4.
