
On Saturday, January 10, 2004, The Pleasant Places of Florida, A Scion Society of The Baker Street Irregulars, held a film festival at the Palm Harbor Library in Palm Harbor, FL. It was great fun for the members as well as for non-members of the public who came to enjoy it with us.

We featured a comparison of two versions of 'The Red Headed League.' One with Ronald Howard as Sherlock, and H. Marion Crawford as Dr. Watson, and one with Jeremy Brett as Sherlock, and David Burke as Dr. Watson.

The viewings were followed by a lively discussion of how closely each film followed Dr Watson's record of the case and also which actor portrayed Sherlock Holmes most accurately. Of course, we had to keep in mind that one was written while having to keep a half hour time slot in mind, and the other had a whole hour to do the portrayal. The discussion ended, however, with the judgment that, at least in The Case of The Red Headed League, the Jeremy Brett version followed the record closely. As far as the best Sherlock, discussion followed as to whether Sherlock is studiously contemplative or flamboyantly so. Once again, the Jeremy Brett portrayal won as the most believable Sherlock. Who's to say who will be the winner in the next case of the Master Detective, besides the members of The Pleasant Places of Florida, that is!
