

LEEK and HAM QUICHE

(This delicacy was squeeked to Caroline Everett, PPofF, by Basil of Baker Street)


Ingredients: 1 deep uncooked 9"pie crust;

l pkg(2 3/4oz)leek soup mix;
l½c. milk; ½c. Half & Half; l½c.shredded
Swiss cheese; 3 eggs slightly beaten; l
tsp. dry mustard; dash of pepper; l can
(4½oz)deviled ham; and 2tbls of fine dry
bread crumbs.

Directions: In saucepan, stir together soup mix & milk. Cook over medium heat, stirring, 'til it boils and thickens. Stir in ½ & ½, cheese, eggs, mustard & pepper. Remove from heat. Mix together deviled ham & breadcrumbs; spread mixture over & bake on low rack in 325° oven 50-60min. or 'til custard jiggles only slightly ("Give me facts, Watson.") in center when gently shaken. Remove from oven & let stand for 10 min. before cutting wedges to serve. Makes 6 entrées or 12 appetizer servings. Excellent with cold Romaine soup, an avacado/ grapefruit salad w/blue cheese dressing, and Champagne.











