





The Many Mysteries of Sherlock Holmes

Without a doubt, the most famous pipe smoker in literature (and perhaps in real life, as some believe) was the Master Consulting Detective, Sherlock Holmes. And yet, for all his exactness and attention to detail, Holmes had some rather peculiar pipe smoking habits. For example, he kept his tobacco stored in an open Persian slipper hung by the fireplace (a dryer habitat most likely could not be found in all of Victorian London!),

relished in smoking the dottle (leftover bits of partially burned tobacco) and stored his pipes with the stems down. Unusual habits for a knowledgeable pipe smoker — but then, Sherlock Holmes was an unusual man.

Although no one quite knows exactly when Sherlock Holmes first appeared with a Calabash in his mouth (some say it was Basil Rathbone who introduced this nowfamous pipe to the master detective's character, the original Sherlock Holmes of Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's 19th Century stories only smoked a straight stemmed briar. Bent pipes did not come into use in England until after 1880. The first use of a curved pipe by Sherlock Holmes was portrayed by the stage actor William Gillette in the early 1900's. The reason? Gillette found that it was easier to deliver his lines on stage with a bent pipe in his mouth, rather than a straight bit. Thus it seems that the smoking legends surrounding Sherlock Holmes are, like his cases, anything but "elementary!"
