#### TRUMPINGTON TRIFLE

(A tasty delight discovered by the Master after finding the "Missing Three-Quarter", Godfrey Staunton.)

6 thick slices of pundcake 1 cup sherry or port ½ cup raspberry jam 18 to 24 ladyfingers

Pastry Cream ½ cup heavy cream, whipped Candied cherry halves

Arrange slices of cake in serving dish. Spoon over ½ c. of the sherry to saturate cake evenly. Spread jam on top. Dip ladyfingers into remaining wine & arrange on top. Cover with Pastry Cream and chill. Top with whipped cream and decorate with candied cherry halves. Makes 12 servings


#### Pastry Cream


Beat 5 egg yolks thoroughly in bowl. Combine 2/3 c. sugar with 1/3 c. all-purpose flour & dash of salt. Beat into egg yolks. Heat 2 c. milk just to a boil. Add hot milk slowly to egg mix, beating constantly. Return to saucepan & place over low heat. Stir until thick & smooth. Remove from heat. Beat in 1 tblsp. butter & 1½ tsp. vanilla. Cool to room temp. before putting on top of ladyfingers.

(Not recommended for those on a diet - unless no-one is looking!)
