




#### STEAK and KIDNEY PIE

(A special Lammas Day (Aug.1) treat submitted Mrs. 'usdon(Joan Wood) and Charlotte Long, gourmet Mayor of HOLMES Beach, Florida.)

2 lb.beef sirloin or top round, cut in 1"cubes 15 lb.beef or veal kidney

Salt & pepper

⅓ c. butter ½ c. chopped onion

4 oz.can sliced mushrooms, drained

2½ c. beef stock 1/4 t. pepper

1 bay leaf

2 t.chopped parsley Pinch each marjoram & powered cloves

1 T. dry sherry


1 t. Worcestershire Pastry to cover top

Soak kidney in salted water for 1 hour. Dry & cut in ½"slices. Dust beef & kidney in flour seasoned with salt & pepper.

Sauté beef, kidney, & onion in butter till brown. Add beef stock & remaining ingredients. Cover & simmer 1-14 hrs.till meat is tender.

Place mixture in greased casserole & let Make vents in pastry.

Bake in 450° oven for 10 min. Lower heat to 375° & bake for 30-40 min. longer or til crust is browned & the filling hot.



#### My dear Watson,

Said Sherlock Holmes to his old friend "Detection is, or ought to be, an exact science and should be treated in the same cold and emotional manner. You have attempted to tinge it with romanticism, which produces much the same effect as if you worked a love story or an elopement into the fifth proposition of Euclid". ## **Sherlock Holmes outlives creator**

LONDON — Sir Arthur Conan Doyle, born 125 years ago Tuesday, never actually wrote the line "Elementary, my dear Watson," but the character who supposedly said it may never die.

Sherlock Holmes made Doyle rich, famous, gained him a knight-hood and wearied him beyond measure.

"I think of slaying Holmes, winding him up for good and all," Doyle told his mother in desperation. "He takes my mind from better things."

Thousands of people all over the world are convinced that Sherlock Holmes still lives. They write an average of 20 letters a week to 221b Baker Street — an address that didn't exist until the year Doyle died, 1930 — asking Holmes's help.

Holmes is on British television yet again these days. Not counting a new 13-part dramatization already sold for American showing next year — a list of earlier Holmes versions on radio, television, movies and stage "fills 71 pages of an average-sized book," says one authority.

Conan Doyle was born May 22, 1859, in Edinburgh, Scotland, trained as a doctor and patterned Holmes after one of his surgeon tutors, Joseph Bell.

The final irony came in one of the letters sent to 221b Baker Street. It asked Sherlock Holmes: "Could I please have some information on Sir Cannon (sic) Doyle?" 10. Holmes Deerstalker





KURALT: Tomorrow is Sir Arthur Conan Doyle's birthday and lucky for us too. The fortunate happenstance of his birth 114 years ago in Endinburgh, Scotland gave us, eventually, Sherlock Holmes, the master detective and his appreciative and somewhat duller companion Dr. Watson. And also, of course, the Messrs. Gregson and Lestrade, the Scotland Yard bumblers; Wiggins and his band of urchin sleuths, The Baker Street Irregulars; the charming Miss Morstan; Holmes' more brilliant and incredibly sedentary brother Mycroft, and his arch rival the diabolical Professor Moriarty. But Conan Doyle, it seems, was always trying to close the case book on Holmes. He had more serious writing in mind and he kept trying to get to it. First he removed Dr. Watson, the chronicler of Holmes' adventures, from the flat the two of them shared at 221-B Baker Street. Married him off to the charming Miss Morstan. Without Watson, Doyle probably figured that would be the end of it. But the public wouldn't have it, so soon Watson was stopping around the flat, or Holmes would roust him from married life and off they'd go rattling across London in a hansom cab toward Waterloo Station or the seedier side of town to find a murderer or untangle a problem for the hereditary King of Bohemia. Once, Doyle even killed Holmes off but those of us who really knew Holmes doubted he was dead, and he wasn't. We can only thank Sir Arthur Conan Doyle for bringing Holmes back again and again, even though he may have thought there were more serious and important things to be done. Sherlock Holmes is an inspiration, a triumph of the mind in art and we continue to follow his trail--always in admiration, always a dozen paces behind.
