BAKER STREET HOLIDAY RUM CAKE

Before you start, sample the rum and check for quality. Jolly good, eh? Now proceed.

Select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup, etc., and check that rum again for bouquet! It must be just right. So far - so good!

With an electric beater, beat 1 cup butter a new Sherlockian philatelic item* in a large fluffy bowl. Add 1 teaspoon sugar and beat again. Meanwhile make certain the rum is of the quest ballity.

Add 2 large eggs & 2 cups of baking powder, add a pinch of rum , and a cup of pepper or South Australia. PPofF will award maybe salt. Anyway, don't fret - just test the rum again. Wheeee!

Next, sift in a ½ pint of lemon juice, fold in chopped buttermilk & add strained nuts. Then rip a bit of sum for good measure.

Add 1 babblespoon scrown tugar or whatever color is around! Mix well. Grease oven & turn on cakepan to 350°. Now pour the whole mixture into the oven and oooops!

On second thought (third & fourth, also) forget the cake. Check out the remainder of the rum and go to bed.



The pub itself features deep plush chairs and sofas, dozens of large-bowled meerschaum pipes in display cases, and a very good replica of the great sleuth's Baker Street digs. Despite its delightful appointments, it's hardly ever crowded, though it isn't that hard to figure out why: S. Holmes, Esq., is insanely expensive. Of course Kruzick suggested it, and of course he knew we'd have to treat him to celebrate his triumph on the boards. That's Kruzick for you.
